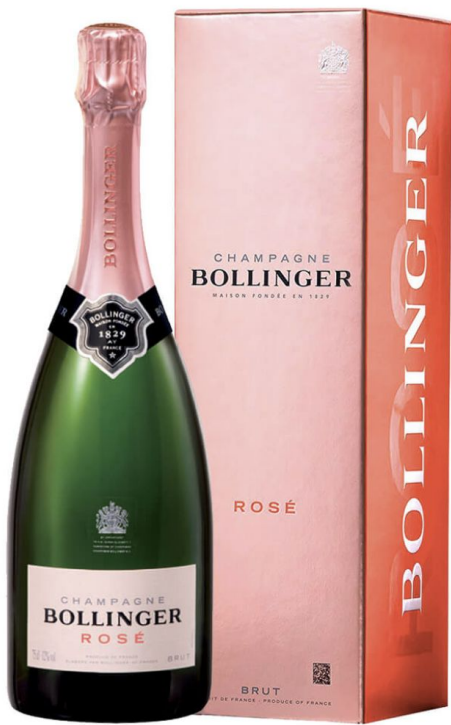

Best Rosé Wines

Minuty Prestige 2020 (\$30): If you notice just one wine on the beach in south of France, it's almost always Minuty Prestige. Can't make it to Europe? Sipping Minuty is the next best thing. Sourced from two estate vineyards—the original estate vineyard in Saint-Tropez and Chateau Verez in the hills of Vidauban—this rosé is beautifully pale with pomelo highlights.



Champagne Bollinger Brut Rosé NV (\$110):

Fresh as a rosé, balanced as a Bollinger, as they say. Perfect for a picnic on a summer afternoon, as a pre-dinner drink or served with a fruity and tart dessert.

Champagne Ayala Rosé Majeur (\$72): Rosé Majeur's very high proportion of Chardonnay and the aging process result in a Champagne with remarkable finesse.
